In the two roles above from 2014 to 2022, Karolina investigated numerous marine incidents and claims, including groundings, fire, explosion, allisions and collisions, attending on site where necessary, and provided expert advice and legal reports. She has also provided expert advice for safety of ports and terminals, personal injury claims, navigational issues, ship hull biofouling (speed and performance claim), cargo stowage related damage during heavy weather, cargo shortage and ship stability issue.

Karolina prepared expert opinions on anchor damage to underwater cables, business interruption claims, hatch cover issues, bulk cargo self-heating issues, project cargo shifting and damage, including semi-submersible ship cargo unloading.

In a Fixed Object Damage case, Karolina successfully established cause and fault for tanker damage to a jetty, enabling a reduction in the original claim from USD52m to USD27m for a reputable P&I Club in London.

In addition, Karolina carried out Flag State vessel inspections on behalf of the Bahamas Maritime Authority and warranty surveys for various clients on Ro-Ro and heavy lift cargo sea-fastening, loading and unloading attendances as well as conducted associated vessel suitability surveys. As a third-party representative, she protected clients' interests during cable laying, dredging and rock dumping vessels' operations.
